Who Murdered William Napoleon Gibbs?



San Diego County Crime Stoppers and the San Diego County Sheriff's Department's Homicide Detail continue to look for leads in the 2005 unsolved murder of 18-year-old William Napoleon Gibbs.

On March 19, 2005, deputies from the Lemon Grove Sheriff Station responded to the 8000 block of Lemon Grove Way regarding an assault with a deadly weapon. When deputies arrived they found the victim, William Gibbs, lying in the driveway of a residence. Witnesses stated they saw William and two other males talking in front of an apartment complex when two black males approached William and his friends. Both males produced a gun and as William was attempting to get away one of the suspects shot William. The suspects then fled the area on foot. Cause of death was due to a gunshot wound. (SDSD CN: 05-027011H)

At the time of the crime the suspects were described as:

Suspect #1: Black male adult, 18 years old, short "afro", goatee, 6'0", 185lbs, red hooded sweatshirt, blue jeans

Suspect #2: Black male adult, 18 years old, short "afro", clean shaven, 5'10", 160lbs, gray hooded sweatshirt, blue jeans
