***Please note that pursuant to penal code 849.5, detentions are no longer included in the arrest report total. Therefore, arrest reports appear to be lower than in previous months.

In September 2020, an additional 412 individuals were detained. Of those, force was used in 26 cases.

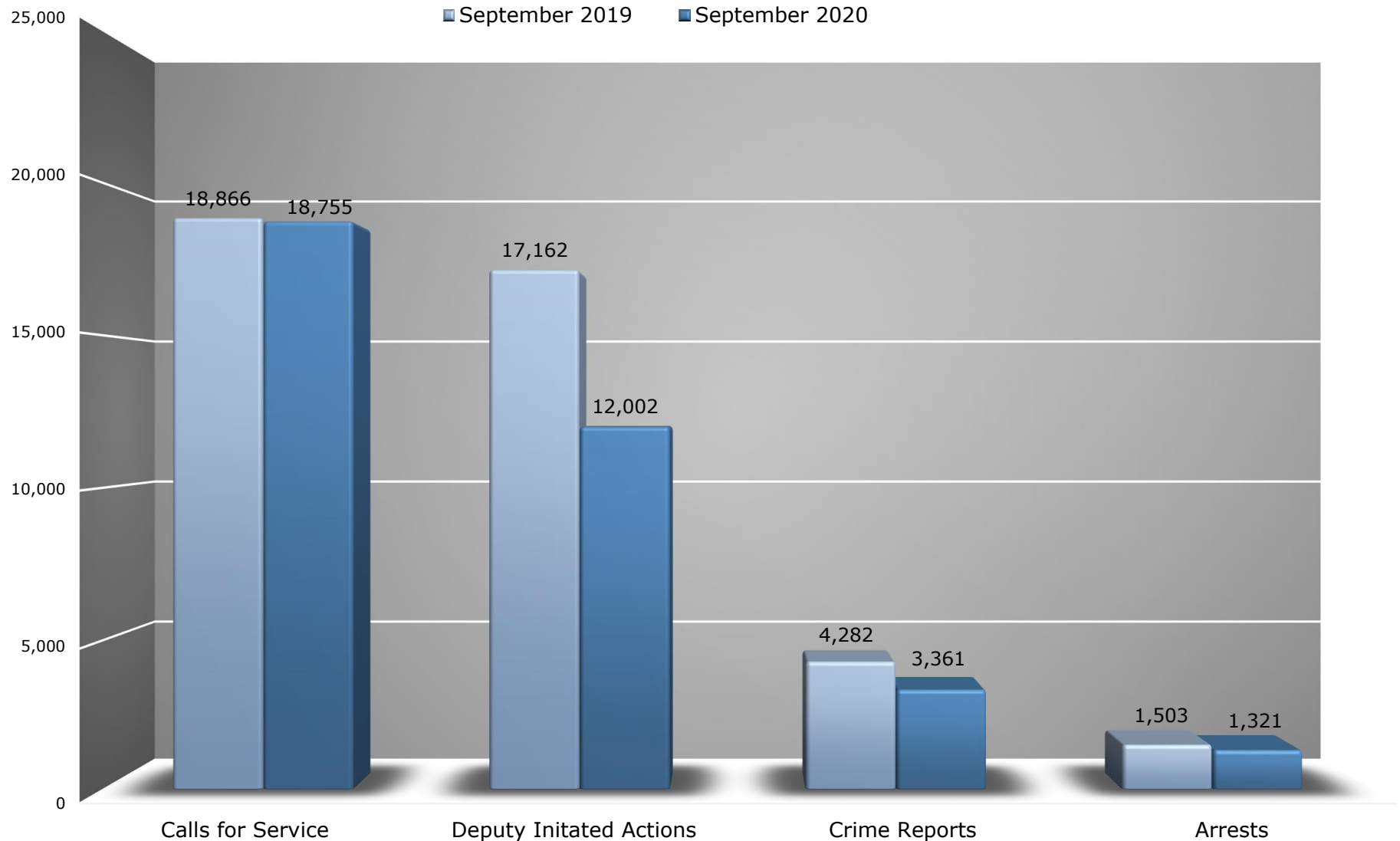

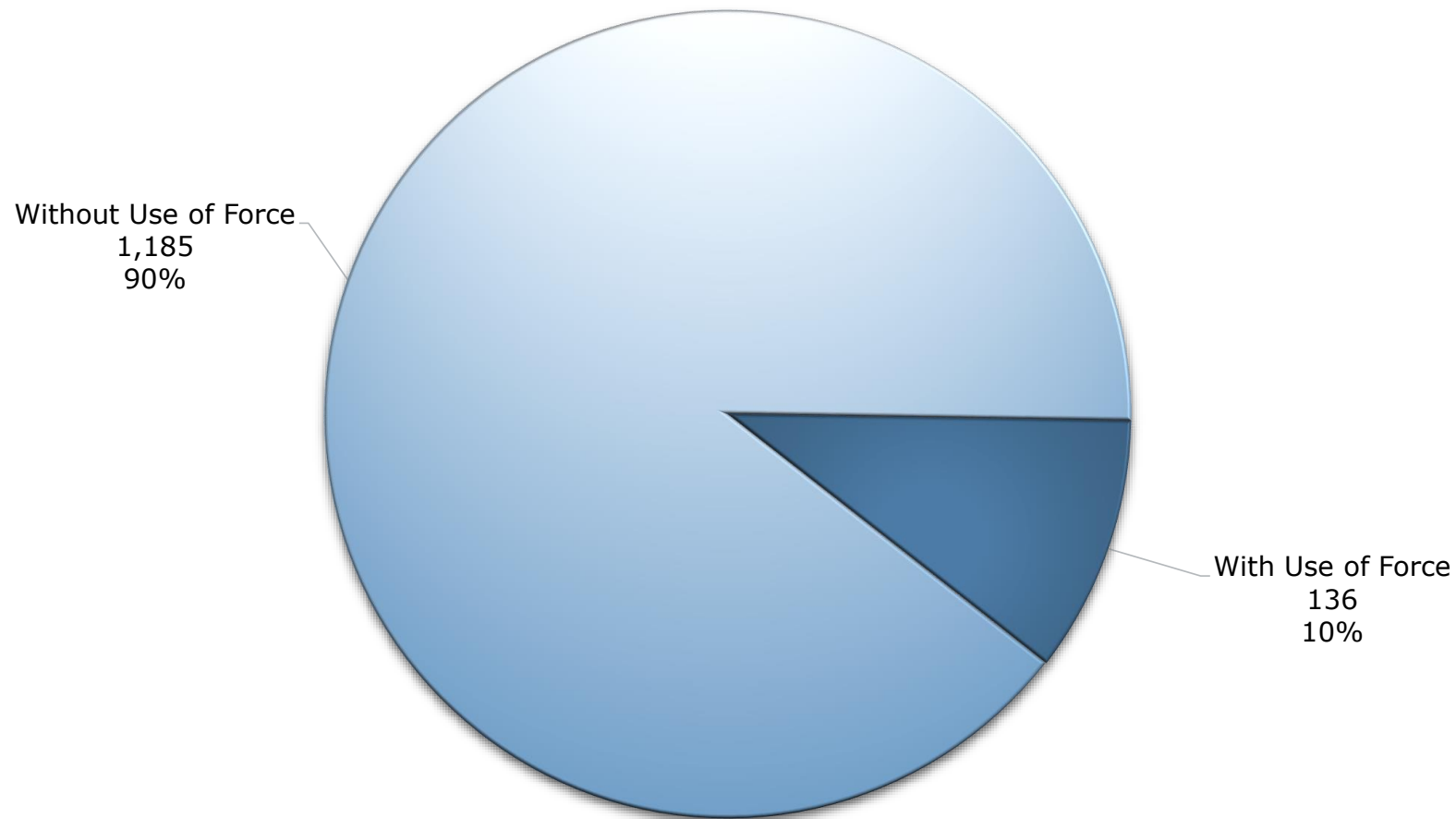
